

# **Basic Small Animal Massage Certification**

## Practitioner 02 – Body Mechanics & Practical Physiology

### **Course Description**

This course is the second of the training required to become a certified animal massage therapist. This course is intended to develop skills and build on concepts introduced in *Practitioner 01 (Introduction to Therapeutic Animal Massage)*.

The focus of this module is to hone the student's skill in massage techniques, address specific animal demographic and lifestyle considerations, and prepare the student for interacting with professional colleagues.

This course curriculum incorporates multimodal learning opportunities by utilizing self-paced online learning, small group size in-person training, hands-on practice with mannequins, and supervised interactions with volunteer clients and patients.

Completion of the self-paced, in-person clinical training, and independently completed case studies allow for compilation of classroom material and the development of technical skills.

#### **Method of Instruction**

This course consists of three parts:

- 1) Module 1: Self-Paced Learning The self-paced portion of this course is available online for students to work through independently and at their own pace.
- 2) Module 2: In-Person Clinical Intensive An in-person, intensive, three-day learning event with small classroom sizes and a high teacher to student ratio.
- 3) Module 3: Independent Case Work Students will independently complete four case studies after successfully finishing both the self-paced and in-person course work.

#### **Enrollment Prerequisites**

- 1) Education & Experience: Completion of Practitioner01: Introduction to Animal Therapeutic Massage
- 2) Age: At least 18 years old at time of enrollment

#### **Course Objectives**

- 1) Expand anatomic knowledge of regions commonly affected by clinical pathologies
- 2) Develop competence in massage techniques
- 3) Develop competence in safe animal handling techniques
- 4) Develop competence in gait & conformation analysis
- 5) Refine SOAP medial record techniques
- 6) Introduce breed, age, conformation, activity, injury specific massage techniques
- 7) Introduce concepts of immune system & disease transmission physiology

- 8) Introduce pathophysiology concepts for common disease encountered by the massage practitioner
- 9) Introduce & discuss hospice, quality-of-life, & euthanasia topics

### Module 3 – Independent Case Work (36 Hours)

Students will complete 4 case studies independently and submit case information for review and grading. Case work must be completed within 6 months of finishing the clinical intensive module (Module 2).

#### **Course Evaluation**

Students must receive >70 score to proceed through each section of Module 1: Self-Paced Learning.

Students must receive a PASS on a practical evaluation to successfully complete Module 2: Clinical Intensive.

Each section of the practical exam is awarded one of the following numeric grades:

Practitioner01- ADM01

- 1 Unsatisfactory
- 2 Needs Improvement
- 3 Fair
- 4 Good
- 5- Excellent

A FAIL grade will be assigned in the following cases:

- 2+ "Unsatisfactory" scores
- 3+ "Needs improvement" scores

Students must complete and receive a PASS on four independently completed case studies within six (6) months of completing the Clinical Intensive. Each massage series consists of the following:

- Completed medical records from each massage visit (three visits within each series)
- A 5-7 minute case summary video
